The traffic can be heavy and often moving at a higher rate of speed than is safe. Fog in this mountain range can be haunting, to say the least. Rare spectacular views can suddenly appear that hold you breathless. Yet, it is the peril that lies ahead that quickly brings your soul to the point of realization... you've got to go through it! The highway hugs the mountain side travelling ahead and directly beneath the deepest darkest patch of fog... directly beneath the vortex seen at the mountain top.
